AT THE DIVINE LITURGY TODAY: Our theme for this Nineteenth Sunday after Holy Pentecost accentuates the UNSELFISH LOVE that is to characterize the interpersonal actions of Jesus' true followers. The observance relative to the Holy Fathers of the Seventh Nicean Ecumenical Council focuses our attention upon the deposit of the TRUE FAITH of the Church and how it is to be preserved, practiced, and transmitted. As love increases, faith becomes more fervent and truly dynamic. Genuine faith will influence every aspect of our lives.

COMMEMORATION OF THE SEVENTH UNIVERSAL COUNCIL TODAY.....Our Byzantine Catholic Church remembers on this particular Sunday in October the 350 hierarchs who participated in the Seventh Ecumenical Council at Nicea in 787 A.D. The controversy concerning iconoclasm was resolved definitively, and the Church's irrevocable position relative to icons was defined solemnly by the hierarchs (mostly all of whom were Byzantine bishops) who attended this seventh universal council. The heresy of iconoclasm was initiated by the Byzantine Emperor Leo the Isaurian in 726 A.D., and it forbade the use of sacred images or icons and other such decorations in the Christian Church. The true doctrine of the Church formulated by this council states: "Images of Jesus, His Most Holy Mother, and of the saints should be made....veneration should be given to them....because the honor that they receive refers to the subjects that they represent, so that by kissing icons....we adore Jesus Christ, and we venerate His saints whose likenesses they represent." Therefore, it is readily evident that from the time of antiquity, the constant teaching of the Church has been that proper respect and due veneration be given to holy icons. After the Seventh Ecumenical Council had rendered this authoritative decision, sacred images and religious decorations were restored again to the Church of Christ. In making this special commemoration, our Byzantine Catholic Church reminds all of us, its faithful people, even today about the sacred traditions that have been established, defined, and transmitted over the centuries by the Holy Fathers who have participated in such ecumenical councils. Our duty then is to preserve and defend this spiritual treasure of our holy faith which is held within the repository of the Church. We must live and practice the faith according to the mandates and the precepts which originally were established by the Church and then were maintained over the many centuries from the earliest times of Christianity until this present day.

EPISTLE: II Corinthians 11:31-12:9 ~ Hebrews 13:7-16 (for the Feast)

The God and Father of the Lord Jesus knows, he who is blessed forever, that I do not lie. At Damascus, the governor under King Aretas guarded the city of Damascus, in order to seize me, but I was lowered in a basket through a window in the wall and escaped his hands. I must boast; not that it is profitable, but I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know someone in Christ who, fourteen years ago (whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows), was caught up to the third heaven. And I know that this person (whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows) was caught up into Paradise and heard ineffable things, which no one may utter. About this person I will boast, but about myself I will not boast, except about my weaknesses.

Although if I should wish to boast, I would not be foolish, for I would be telling the truth. But I refrain, so that no one may think more of me than what he sees in me or hears from me because of the abundance of the revelations. Therefore, that I might not become too elated, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me.

Remember your leaders who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teaching. It is good to have our hearts strengthened by grace and not by foods, which do not benefit those who live by them. We have an altar from which those who serve the tabernacle have no right to eat. The bodies of the animals whose blood the high priest brings into the sanctuary as a sin offering are burned outside the camp. Therefore, Jesus also suffered outside the gate, to consecrate the people by his own blood. Let us then go to him outside the camp, bearing the reproach that he bore. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the one that is to come. Through him [then] let us continually offer God a sacrifice of praise, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have; God is pleased by sacrifices of that kind.

GOSPEL: Luke 8:5-15 ~ John 17:1-13 (for the Feast)

"A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path and was trampled, and the birds of the sky ate it up. Some seed fell on rocky ground, and when it grew, it withered for lack of moisture. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some seed fell on good soil, and when it grew, it produced fruit a hundredfold." After saying this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear ought to hear."

Then his disciples asked him what the meaning of this parable might be. He answered, "Knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of God has been granted to you; but to the rest, they are made known through parables so that 'they may look but not see, and hear but not understand.' This is the meaning of the parable. The seed is the word of God. Those on the path are the ones who have heard, but the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts that they may not believe and be saved. Those on rocky ground are the ones who, when they hear, receive the word with joy, but they have no root; they believe only for a time and fall away in time of trial. As for the seed that fell among thorns, they are the ones who have heard, but as they go along, they are choked by the anxieties and riches and pleasures of life, and they fail to produce mature fruit. But as for the seed that fell on rich soil, they are the ones who, when they have heard the word, embrace it with a generous and good heart, and bear fruit through perseverance.

When Jesus had said this, he raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your son, so that your son may glorify you, just as you gave him authority over all people, so that he may give eternal life to all you gave him. Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ. I glorified you on earth by accomplishing the work that you gave me to do. Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began. I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours, and everything of mine is yours and everything of yours is mine, and I have been glorified in them. And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are. When I was with them I protected them in your name that you gave me, and I guarded them, and none of them was lost except the son of destruction, in order that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you. I speak this in the world so that they may share my joy completely."
